STRATEGY STATEMENT

Catch-up priorities

1. To reduce the attainment gap between disadvantaged students and their peers
2. To raise the attainment of all students to close the gap created by COVID-19 school closure

Strategy

1. Enable and support quality first teaching strategies under COVID-19 conditions, through resources and training
2. Small group tuition in literacy and numeracy across all year groups for specific individuals
3. Develop and support on-line learning resources to increase student access to resources and mitigate against future periods of isolation/lockdown
4. Support strategies to remove external barriers to regular attendance and engagement in lessons
