Top 5 most common mistakes from the November exam:

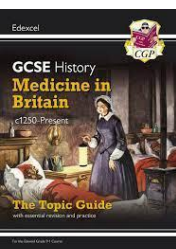
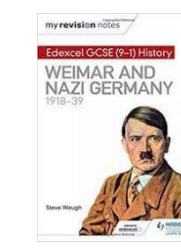
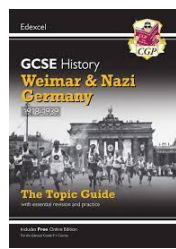
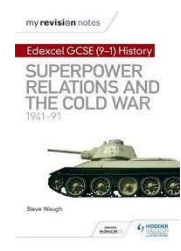
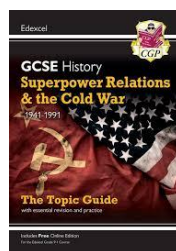
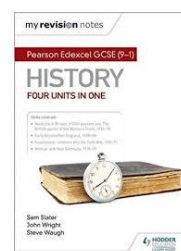
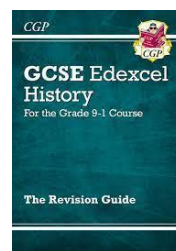
1. Not understanding what the question was asking them to do.
2. Not reading the provenance of a source.
3. Keep to the timing of the questions 4 marks = 5 minutes.
4. Always link back to the topic in the question.
