Students will have premade templates to work from.	Students will explore similar skills in Graphics in Y7 when using Nets.  Students will have an opportunity to explore further papercrafts and folding in y8.
	<b>Year 8 The Future of Sustainable Fashion (Design and sample a school uniform)</b>	Screenprinting removed from process due to practicalities, students will examine one practical process instead. Students will work in 2D dry materials instead, exploring batik making.	Students will have pre-made templates to work from provided that they will need to modify to suit their own design. Batik process will be using cold/dry materials for most students using oil pastel. Hot wax demonstrated under visualiser to show scope.	Students may have an opportunity to use Batik as part of their Yr9/10/11 Textiles project. There will be an opportunity to develop further techniques, such as screenprinting and image transfer if GCSE is opted.
	<b>Year 9 Key Designers (Design and create a screenprint exhibition campaign)</b>	No changes.	Some students may not use screenprinting processes. This will depend on 48 hour cross quarantine of equipment. These students will work by hand using their stencil.	Key designer project will link to later GCSE options (FPN/GR/TX/RM) and Term 5/6 key skills development project.
