Drama is a practical subject so be ready to be active. You will explore: Freeze Frames, Thought Tracking, Role-play, Thought Tunnel and so much.



Please see here some examples of a completed role on the wall




Instructions:

- Name
- The feelings he shows about his other characters
- Hobbies
- Age
