Abbey Park School English & Maths Combined Outcomes








Abbey Park School Science Outcomes





1. Understand it: Subject Information Packs




Course content - BEST understood during initial teaching and learning.

PLUGGING GAPS

- Check your **PLCs** to identify uncertain areas
- >Use an online or physical revision guide
- > Attend intervention sessions
- > Attend relevant session 6
- Ask your teachers; check in textbooks; go back over notes
- Ask a friend to explain use peer expertise






3.Memorise it!

The Park Academies Trust

- Medium term memory regular reviews
- ✓ Read over notes / texts at intervals
- Short term memory: strategies to recall your condensed notes
 - ✓ Look, cover, write, check
 - ✓ Ask someone to test you
 - ✓ Use of images / symbols / colours "see" your condensed notes
 - Display to absorb around the bedroom / house!
 - Mnemonics first letter triggers; logical ordering
 - Make and listen to recordings







4. Practise it!



Practise <u>past questions</u> in school and as part of your <u>personal revision at home</u>:

- ✓ English exam Friday
- ✓ Maths past paper club from term 3
- √ Session 6 revision
- √ Easter revision
- **✓ The Student Shared area**

Know the structure of your exam papers:

TIMINGS, MARKS, LENGTH of answers, phraseology of questions, COMAND words, required Extended Written Responses



5. Check it!



1st stage revision – learn CONDENSED notes

Revision cards / mind maps / mnemonics

- ✓ Look, cover, write, check
- ✓ Ask someone to test you
- ✓ Record and check

2nd stage revision – past questions

- ✓ Mark schemes
- ✓ Engage with teacher feedback
- ✓ Mock cycle 1 and 2
- ✓ Past paper clubs:
 - English Exam Friday
 - Maths Past Paper Club

At home – past papers; hand questions to teachers for feedback
